Water Conservation Notice/System Pressure Advisory!

Due to power outage and a significant number of leaks from Hurricane Florence, Pamlico County Water System is under a mandatory water conservation notice. The following activities are prohibited:

- Filling swimming pools
- Washing motor vehicles
- Outdoor watering

We are requesting that all customers restrict water use to essential needs only.

Residents are requested to check their water service and if possible, check vacant neighbors' lots and are requested to report leaks to Pamlico County Administrative office at (252) 745-3133.

In addition, the following areas are under a low-pressure advisory:

- Intersection of HWY 307 and HWY 304 including all of HWY 307 and HWY 304 and the Towns of Vandemere, Mesic, Hobucken, and Lowland including all adjoining roads from the main arteries.

Periods of low or no pressure in the distribution system increases the potential for back siphonage and introduction of bacteria into the water system.

Therefore, the Pamlico County Water Department advises that when water is restored consumers **boil all water** used for human consumption (including drinking, cooking, brushing teeth, making ice and washing hands) or use bottled water.

Vigorous boiling for one (1) minute should kill any disease-causing organisms that may be present in the water.

This office is strongly urging the water consumers to conserve water whenever possible. This advisory remains in effect until further written notification is issued.
