The Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) has studied the risk factors and needs of Juvenile Court involved youth in this county and hereby publishes this Request for Proposals. The JCPC anticipates funds from the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (DJJDP) in the amount stated above to fund the program types specified below. Such programs will serve delinquent and at-risk youth for the state **fiscal year 2010-2011** beginning on, or after, **July 1, 2010**. The use of DJJDP funds in this county **requires a local match** in the amount specified above.

The JCPC will consider proposals for the following needed Programs:

1. Restitution/Community Services substance Abuse assessment and counseling for youth and adults/family members
2. Counseling Services-in the school setting for youth at risk for delinquency, dropping out of school, and substance abuse.
3. Parent/Family skill building and mentoring services which will work with identified youth and families.
4. Interpersonal Skill building programs to promote positive peer associations.

Proposed Program Services should target the following Risk Factors for Delinquency or Repeat Delinquency:

1. Alcohol and Substance Abuse by Juveniles
2. To reduce subsequent Complaints involving juveniles
3. To reduce violations of community supervision
4. To reduce subsequent Convictions by juveniles
5. To fulfill restitution contracts by juveniles offenders
6. To Increase parental accountability

Programs should address the following concerns as reported in the Needs Assessments for Adjudicated Youth:

Peer Domain:

Peer Domain - 79% of adjudicated youth have problems with peer associations – not substantially changed from prior year

Individual Domain:

Individual Domain - At a minimum, 89% of youth have some level of mental health need.

Individual Domain - At a minimum, 89% of adjudicated youth have some level of substance abuse – increase from prior years

Individual Domain - At a minimum, 50% of adjudicated youth are known to have been victims of abuse themselves – no significant change.

Individual Domain - 22% of adjudicated youth are known to have engaged in some level of sexually deviant or criminal behavior.

Family Domain:

Family Domain - 74% of adjudicated youth come from homes where parent/guardian supervision skills are deficient – no significant change from prior year.

Family Domain - At a minimum, 68% of adjudicated youth come from homes where one or more family members have a current or prior involvement with the criminal justice system or are gang involved – slight decrease from prior year

Family Domain - At a minimum, 58% of adjudicated youth come from homes where one or more family members are abusing substances or alcohol – increase from prior years.

Family Domain - At a minimum, 26% of adjudicated youth are known to come from homes where there is some level of domestic conflict – decrease from prior year.

School Domain:

School Domain - 74% of adjudicated youth have moderate to severe behavioral problems at school – a slight decrease from prior year

Applicants are being sought that are able to address the legislatively mandated items below:

1. Program services compatible with research that is shown to be effective with juvenile offenders.
2. Program services are outcome-based.
3. The program has an evaluation component.
4. Program services detect gang participation and divert individuals from gang participation.
5. Programs that can have a demonstrable impact on the following success factors: a) reduce the use of alcohol or controlled substances; b) reduce subsequent complaints; c) reduce violation of terms of community supervision; d) reduce convictions for subsequent offenses; e) fulfill restitution to victims; and f) increase parental accountability.
