

HOW TO COMPLETE THE DISASTER ASSESSMENT REPORT

THIS IS NOT A FEMA FORM.

Why people receiving damage to their primary home or rental home need to complete this form?

The Pamlico County Disaster Recovery Coalition (PCDRC) and the county manager's office need this information to identify who received damage, how much, the area you live in, where flooding occurred for the first time, who needs more financial and volunteer assistance to restore your home, where you are in the recovery phase, what kind of help you need now in order to return to as normal a life as possible. Our goal as the PCDRC is to get volunteer groups in the county to help with the rebuild process and get donations and grants to pay for building materials. The county will use this information to report damage statistics to FEMA and the state to try and get more disaster funding.

NAME – The legal name that is on your deed, or tax notice. verified. Only the legal owner has the right to accept tear out and rebuild help. The owner will be required to sign off on any work performed. If your rental home was damaged and you need housing assistance please complete this form where applicable.

DAMAGES – **Minor damage** - such as a few shingles missing, some leaks, mold treated and contained. Easily restored to prior condition.

Major Damage - flooding or roof issues with extensive leaks, house has to be torn out and mold treatment required. Residents may or may not be able to reside in the house. House can be rebuilt.

Destroyed – damage too severe to be rebuilt. Must be torn down or abandoned.

APPLYING FOR FEMA AND/OR SBA LOAN - Everyone receiving damage needs to register with FEMA.

Deadline December 13, 2018. If denied, appeal. **File for SBA loan, low interest for businesses, individuals, and renters.** The loan helps pay for repairs not covered by FEMA or insurance. If denied, return denial letter to FEMA to see if you can get other needs assistance grants to cover personal property, childcare assistance, transportation assistance, moving or storage expenses, etc.

TEMPORARY HOUSING – Pamlico County, as of October 30, 2018, qualifies for temporary housing. See form on the back side to explain the process for receiving temporary housing. We need to know who needs it.

THE ESTIMATED DOLLAR AMOUNT –Refers to any estimates that the homeowner has received from FEMA, their insurance, or their contractor.

OTHER –Needs such as : space heaters, blankets, clothing, furniture or appliances, etc. The PCDRC will call you to see if we can help you with any of these needs. Let them know we are trying and get help to our citizens. This intake will help us gather information for rebuild teams and organizations that fund grants for building supplies, etc.

Questions? If unsure duct work needs removing, or mold treatment needed, check yes. Volunteers groups will check this before work begins. **Use the back of form to explain damages/repairs.**

SIGNATURE - Please sign and date the form to indicate that your information is truthful. This will be verified by someone before volunteers are sent to your home to help meet your needs.
